

VENUE HISTORY

The Capitol Theatre reopened in 2012 after a massive, multi-million dollar renovation. No detail went untouched while lovingly restoring this rock palace to its original splendor. State-of-the-art sound, lighting, video and digital projection mapping has elevated The Capitol Theatre event and concert experience to its fullest.

Designed by noted architect Thomas Lamb, The Capitol Theatre opened in 1926, as a playhouse built for Vaudeville and Cinema. One of the premier venues in rock 'n' roll history — having hosted such legendary acts as Pink Floyd, Janis Joplin and the Grateful Dead — the reborn theater has grown to become Westchester's premier concert venue and event space.
